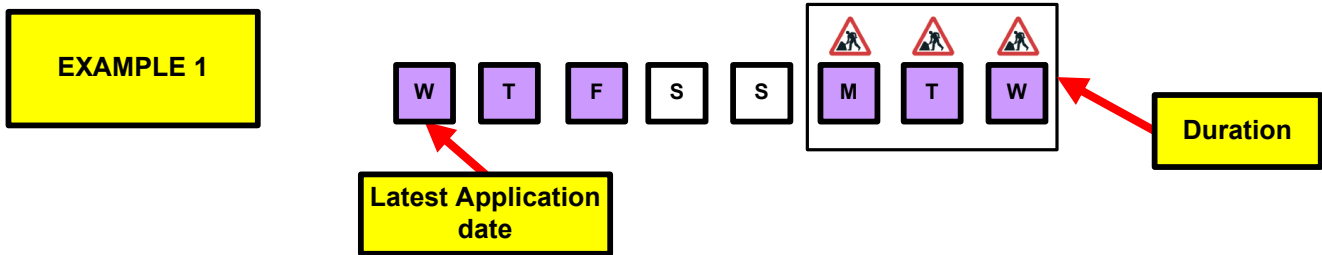


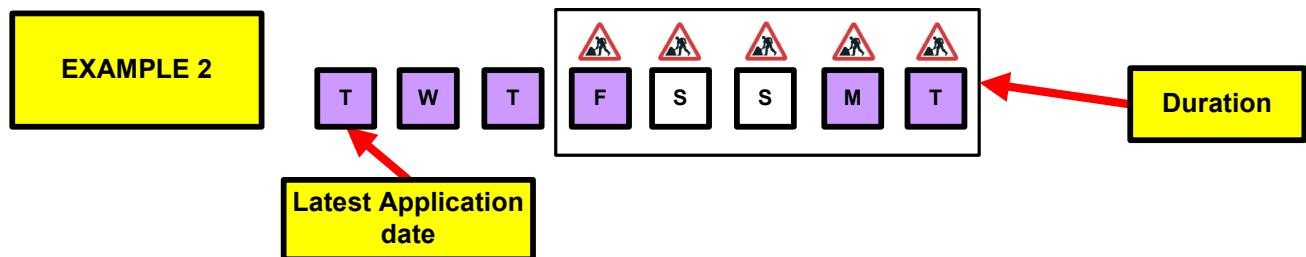
## Planned Works – Durations and Working Days

- NOTES
- A 'Working' Day is any day apart from a Saturday, Sunday or Bank Holiday
  - 3 Working days is the maximum duration allowed for Minor Works on a Permit Application
  - Two Working days is the S74 prescribed period, therefore, an Undertaker is **ALWAYS** allowed a minimum of two working days for any works type under the S74 regulations which have not been altered by GMRaps
  - GMRaps councils must not work outside of the Permit and S74 regulations
  - Always use the GMRaps Refusal codes and text if any permit is refused



The duration above is acceptable under the GMRaps Regulations and should not be refused unreasonably, however in **exceptional** circumstances the Permit Authority may refuse for the following duration related reasons:

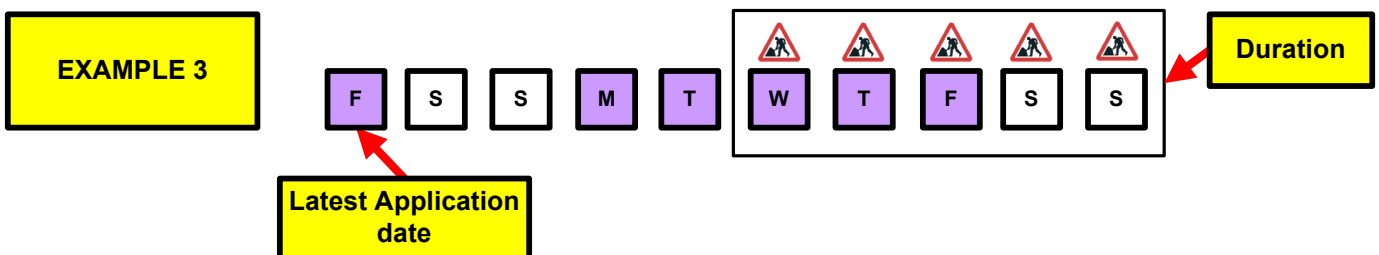
- If it is strongly believed that works can be completed to a high standard in a shorter timeframe
- In a particularly traffic sensitive situation where the works will cause a great deal of disruption, either due to the location on the highway and/or traffic management type



The duration above is perfectly acceptable under the GMRaps Regulations and should not be refused unreasonably, however the Application should indicate that works will take place on the 'Non Working Days' if works are to take place at the weekend. If not indicated on the Granted Application, Weekend working must be requested via Variation by the promoter

As in example 1, Duration related Refusals may be used in **exceptional** circumstances

- Another example may be refuse and request a condition that works must be cleared at the weekend or Friday night if the area is particularly busy one at weekends (a shopping or nightclub area) but only if this is practical and reasonable



The duration above is acceptable under the GMRaps Regulations and should not be refused unreasonably, however the Application should indicate that works will take place on the 'Non Working Days' if works are to take place at the weekend.
